## 3 What Matters 2 You – Progress Update

What Matters 2 You (Whitfield) aims to engage and support families across the Whitfield area. A values based leadership experience took place earlier in May with 14 north east practitioners taking part, focusing on leadership skills and developing an action based plan for developing the approach in the area.

The main, initial developments are:

Engagement to identify what support best meets the needs of Whitfield families.

Developing and encouraging a culture of hand holding/softening gate keepers as a way of encouraging families to better access available supports.

Recognising the limitations of venues from which support/activities can be delivered across the area and the need to save those building that are at risk of closure.

Strengthened multi agency / partner networking.

A reconnection day for those who attended the above will be held on 25<sup>th</sup> June and an update on progress shared.

5	Funding Update	
	Alcohol and Drugs Partnership Locality Fund  The Community Empowerment Team have met with local school and family development workers over the past quarter in order to support them to come up with creative projects	
	that would address some of the issues they are seeing in schools relating to alcohol and substance misuse. After looking at some of the projects across Dundee, and particularly	

those working with young people, we noticed a gap in the north east ward for preventative projects in schools.

We then organised the beginning of the application process in order to get funds to the correct people, which will be as follows.

<u>Phase 1 Meeting:</u> Thursday 6th June at 3.30pm-5pm in Finmill Centre. The sub group will come together and identify needs and opportunities relating to the prevention of harm and support for recovery in the ward and develop a set of priority actions.

Deadline for applications will be agreed at this meeting but I would advise Friday the 21st June to allow 2 weeks for applications to be finalised. After this date applications will be sent out to the sub group to assess and send any questions or requests for more information to the Community Empowerment Team to chase up.

<u>Phase 2 Meeting:</u> TBC in Phase 1 but provisionally Thursday 11th July. To assess applications and make decisions on the allocation of the funding.

To be eligible for funding applicants should take part in phase 1 and commit to being active participants in the North East LCPP ADP Sub-Group throughout the period of funding.

Whilst participants in Session 1 are encouraged to bid for monies to be allocated in Session 2 they must recuse themselves from the decision-making process for their own applications.

Grants of a minimum of £2000 and a maximum of £6000 can be applied for. Funding will be available in 2024/25 and must be spent by March 31st, 2025. Final reports must be submitted to the Communities Officer by 12th April 2025.

It is hoped that we will see an increase in those being a part of the decision-making process and continue to empower those with lived experience to voice their ideas and perspectives.
