Peter is working with Jennifer to establish what the AIS team could bring to the table.

5	MENTAL HEALTH OF CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE – Jennifer King The purpose of this report is to update the Children and Families Executive Board on strategic

	The Emotional Health and Wellbeing Strategy Consultation	
	This consultation is underway and ends on Friday. The views of young people and Head Teachers have been sought. Elaine Cruickshank informed that this would become an integral part of the NHS Tayside's Live Life Well Mental Health Strategy.

	Counselling in Schools	
	Dundee has received funding but the service is being approached on a Tayside basis and will provide counselling services for children and young people aged 10 and over. The service was established with effect from 1 November. Services are being delivered virtually and young people have engaged well by phone or online platforms.	
	Andy Dingwall has been appointed as Counsellor Co-ordinator and there will be nine providers across Tayside. The service will have continuing support from Educational Psychologies to ensure that the right young people are referred. There has been a pilot with a small number of schools.	
	Funding is in place up to March 2023 and a review will take place mid-term. Jennifer will report to Scottish Government in January/February.	
	The Community Mental Health and Wellbeing Supports & Services Framework – and funding	
	Scottish Government announced funding in September 2020 to provide access for Every child and young person in Scotland to be able to access local community services which support and improve their mental health and emotional wellbeing. Dundee will focus on early intervention to try to prevent escalation of mental ill health. The City Council is working closely with CAMHS and looking at how we can work with local community partners and third sector colleagues. The views of Women's Aid have been sought. Erik will contact Jennifer to discuss third sector involvement. There is a need to look at sustainability and implementation after the end of the funding period. Peter feels that this is an opportunity build and adopt frameworks in and embed in FORT.	
	The Executive Board is happy to approve the direction of travel for the three streams.	
	CORPORATE PARENTING PLAN - Alison Leuchars	
	This report was the third and final annual update on the current 3-year Corporate Parenting Plan 2017-2020. Very positive feedback was received from Elected Members and they are very appreciative of our support. It builds on previous reports and outlines continued progress made by the Council and partners in providing a range of supports to care experienced children and young people which is designed to improve outcomes in their health, wellbeing, attainment and post-school destinations. It also outlines how support has been adapted and maintained during the Covid-19 pandemic. As the Independent Care Review was published shortly before the pandemic in February 2020, the report recommends the submission of a further report outlining the next 3-year plan which will include the local response to the review in December 2020. This will be sent out to partners next week. We are in a strong position as we move forward with the new 3-year plan.	AL
