

Caird Park

One of Dundee's biggest parks with ponds, a historic castle and woodland walks.



Facilities and restrictions

- Sports stadium and velodrome – sorry, no dogs
- Football pitches – please walk elsewhere
- Golf course – on lead please, give way to golf play

Other users to expect

- Cyclists, walkers, cars, footballers, joggers
- Large noisy events

Balgay Park, including Lochee and Victoria Parks

A wooded hill and flat grassy parklands, with many paths and wide quiet roads.



Facilities

- Toilets at Lochee Park Pavillion and Balgay Cemetery waiting room
- 1 mile Doggy Health Trail

Any restrictions

- Football pitches – please walk elsewhere
- Balgay Cemetery – dogs on lead

Other users to expect

- Cyclists especially on Greenways route, families, walkers, footballers at Lochee Park

The Dundee Dog Walking Code

Helping share our parks and green spaces

- Always pick up after your dog
- Keep your dog under control
- Do not allow your dog to chase wildlife
- Cemeteries and golf courses are not for dog exercising. Keep your dog on a short lead and stick to main paths
- Dogs are not allowed in play areas, on sport pitches in use, golf tees, greens or bunkers and where there are ground nesting birds
- Please look out for signs showing local rules. Animals are excluded from some places at certain times
- Keep your dog out of formal flower beds
- Put your dog on a lead near children, picnic areas, horses or sports pitches or if requested by Parks Management Staff

Dog Friendly Dundee

Dundee has great green places, and many are perfect for getting some exercise with your dog. This leaflet provides some information about the best places to walk your dog, and what you may expect to meet there.

All Dundee Parks have seats, information maps, bins and dog waste bins. Dogs are not allowed in play areas, formal garden areas, tennis courts or bowling greens.

Templeton Woods and Clatto Park



Large woodland with wide tracks, and a reservoir.

Facilities

- Toilets at Clatto (seasonal) and Templeton centres

Any restrictions

- Horse riders – Dogs on lead please, to help them pass
- Blue-Green algae in Clatto reservoir is toxic to dogs
- Templeton Mountain Bike Trail – sorry, no dogs

Other users to expect

- Cyclists, families, walkers, horse riders, forestry vehicles

Camperdown Park



Dundee's biggest park with large grass areas and woodland walks.

Facilities

- Toilets at Mansion House and Crow's Nest play area

Any restrictions

- Football pitches – please walk elsewhere
- Golf course – on lead please, give way to golf play

Other users to expect

- Families playing, cyclists, walkers, cars, footballers, joggers
- Occasional large noisy events, including dog shows

The Law

A steep wooded hill, with fantastic views of Dundee. Steep steps, grassy areas and woodland walks.

Facilities

- Toilets at car park

Any restrictions

- Poor sight lines – close control please

Other users to expect

- Cars, walkers, families and tourists

Riverside Nature Park

Wildflower meadows, bird watching, grazed fields and views over the Tay Estuary.

Facilities

- Bird hides and view points

Any restrictions

- Ground nesting birds – dogs on lead and on paths
1st April to 31st July

Other users to expect

- Walkers, bird watchers

Broughty Beach

A popular, long sandy beach, with views of the Tay and Fife.

Facilities

- Toilets at Bridge St and Esplanade car park

Any restrictions

- Animal exclusion in western area – sorry no dogs May to September
Eastern beach open all year

Other users to expect

- Walkers, families at play
- Water craft – boats and jet skis



Baxter Park

A large, park in the heart of Dundee, with mature trees and large grass areas.

Facilities

- Toilet at Glass Pavilion

Any restrictions

- Multi Use Games Area (MUGA) – sorry no dogs

Other users to expect

- Weddings and other celebration events
- Walkers, families at play, cyclists and joggers.

Dudhope Park

A south sloping park with open grass and parkland trees with great views over the city.

Facilities

- Toilet near MUGA

Any restrictions

- Skate park, MUGA, – sorry, no dogs

Other users to expect

- Walkers, cyclists, families playing

Dawson Park

The largest park in the eastern suburbs, mainly flat for easy walking.

Facilities

- Toilets at bowling green
- 1 mile Doggy Health Trail

Any restrictions

- Sports pitches and running track – please walk elsewhere

Other users to expect

- School groups, families, occasional cyclists.
- Large noisy events such as football competitions
