C2003	HaVeN	Coldside	To fund the purchase and installation of a summerhouse in the Law Hill allotment for garden therapy to support those that are affected by serious mental illness including voice hearers and those with diagnosis of psychosis.	£3,700
C2004	HaVeN	Coldside	To fund a Greenspace/Allotment Key Worker who will manage the site and ensure safe practices are followed. With the Summerhouse application this will create a more therapeutic space at the allotments for 31 weekly sessions to be delivered across all activities for those that are affected by serious mental illness.	£643
C2005	Maxwell Centre	Coldside	Funds will be used to purchase and install safety equipment to begin reopening process as soon as possible and keep staff, volunteers and centre attendees as safe from risk of Covid-19 as possible. 500 people across the community will benefit from the centre reopening to provide essential services.	£1,511

EPP2002	Rock Solid Dundee	East End	To fund resurfacing of car park to improve accessibility for everyone to the project and Douglas & Mid Craigie Church. Also to be funded are washable facemasks to be distributed to local families utilising the food larders and food hubs in the area, for use on public transport as this is now essential.	£1,032
L2014	Alzheimer Scotland	Lochee	To provide gardening packs consisting of items such as plant pots, seeds and tools for 10 people living with dementia who can keep active and use the packs in their own home and garden. M2014	Boomerang Fitness	Maryfield	To fund live streaming of fitness classes delivered by experienced instructors for 1 hour every weekday for eight weeks. The classes will be Chair Yoga, Yoga, Pilates, Keep fit and Burlexercise. As restrictions lift small numbers of participants will be invited to join the classes in the centre garden, while still streaming live.	£1,200
M2016	Alzheimer Scotland	Maryfield	To provide gardening packs consisting of items such as plant pots, seeds and tools for 10 people living with dementia who can keep active and use the packs in their own home and garden. They will receive support for one hour per week for 4 weeks from a team member over the telephone or a video call.	£1,000
M2018	BeFriends	Maryfield	To fund a health and wellbeing camp for 5 hours for local children and young people. With different events taking place throughout the day, 40 young people will sign up for events over the day while adhering to social distancing.	£513

NE2006	Orimiston, Inveresk and Salton Residents Association	North East	To fund the cost of continuation of their expanded weekly food provision over the summer holiday period. This has been an essential project during this lockdown period of Covid-19.	£2,000

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NE2007	Fintry Parish Church	North East	To fund 2 fridges and freezers to enable the provision and support of a food larder in Fintry. This project was started in reaction to local food poverty needs initially from Covid-19 and will continue to deliver a food larder provision afterwards.	£4,861
NE2008	Alzheimer Scotland	North East	To provide gardening packs consisting of items such as plant pots, seeds and tools for 10 people living with dementia who can keep active and use the packs in their own home and garden. WE2003	The Gate Church	West End	To fund supply and installation of an Air-to-Air Heat Pump to control temperature and humidity within the Community Fridge, maximising performance and lifespan of appliances while also reducing electricity costs and using renewable energy. The fridge provides short date food free and reduces food waste. During covid-19 the fridge has seen 100 visitors per day.	£2,001

WE2005	Yusuf Youth Initiative	West End	To fund activities one to one or for small families outdoors while adhering to social distancing guidelines. This includes a befriending service offering gardening, exercise and volunteering to support mental health, particularly after Covid-19. Cycling sessions for people who cannot cycle or are not confident on the roads will also be delivered. A tutor and trained volunteers will provide training and bike hire as required.	£2,200
WE2006	Ninewells Community Garden Group	West End	To fund the installation of a fence to stop produce being damaged by animals in this community growing space where fresh produce can be grown and accessed by service users, volunteers and the local community. This project promotes good mental and physical health and helps reduce food poverty with the supply of fresh produce. It supports people of all ages and has a number of linked projects around cooking and gardening while ensuring social distancing guidelines are followed.	£1,450
