C1809	Main Street Café	Coldside	To fund a commercial grade water boiler and panini maker allowing them to continue to cater to the community and expand to meet the demand for services. 50-70 adults per session, twice weekly will benefit from this provision.	£1,104
C1811	Women's Rape and Sexual Abuse Centre	Coldside	Taster workshops for around 12 people, as well as recruit, train and support at least 3 Volunteer Support Workers so that they can help survivors of rape, sexual abuse and exploitation in the ward. Demand is currently very high so more volunteers will mean more support given and reduced waiting lists.	£2,930
EE1807	Douglas Library	East End	To purchase tables, chairs and resources such as a tablet and Lego to help improve the children's area of the library and provide an appropriate designated seating area. This will benefit 100 children.	£822
EE1811	St. Pius X RC Primary School	East End	To fund an outdoor learning classroom to benefit all 200 pupils in the school by providing outdoor mats, cushions and outdoor learning resources, such as wheelbarrows, young gardener and mini beast kits.	£1,100
EE1812	Dundee Pensioners Forum	East End	To pay the cost of the publishing and distribution of 4 newsletters annually. 330 copies of each newsletter highlighting local developments, activities & information relevant to older people will be distributed to those on the mailing list plus local community centres, libraries and sheltered housing complexes.	£403
EE1814	Cullen Place Sheltered Housing Complex	East End	To fund artist's time and resources for a mural project to continue on from the one currently in place, extending along the remainder of the rear shops beside the complex.	£1,500
EE1817	Brington Place Sheltered Housing	East End	To fund 2 garden benches and a table as part of a wider refurbishment of the sheltered housing garden area, in order to make it a more attractive and accessible space for all 109 tenants to use.	£589

L1822	Menziesshill Mums Group	Lochee	Following a successful Easter holiday club for local families, this grant will fund a summer programme, including a trip to Blair Drummond Safari Park. The project encourages families to interact together, plus children can socialise and parents can support each other. 70 people will benefit from this project.	£1,003
L1823	Menziesshill Parish Church	Lochee	To fund Menziesshill's first community Christmas tree with festive lighting, bringing together the whole community in its celebration of Christmas and help widen the sense of community identity.	£858
L1824	Charleston Community Centre LMG	Lochee	The Local Management Group volunteers run a programme of activities in the centre throughout the year for children and young people in Charleston. This grant will fund two free trips for 31 young people to Ryze Trampoline Park in Edinburgh and Active Kids in Stanley.	£667
L1825	Little Starts Toddler Group	Lochee	This playgroup is run at Menziesshill Parish Church 3 mornings each week from birth to 5 years, offering a wide range of play activities and includes snack time for children and refreshments for adults. This funding will allow them to offer this playgroup at a very low cost to the whole community, to support parents and carers of pre-school children. 10 to 30 people benefit from each session.	£1,320

SP1805	Downfield Primary School, Parent Teacher Partnership	Strathmartine	To purchase outdoor play equipment for all 400 pupils to benefit from, as there is currently inadequate equipment and seating in the playground. The school and Parent Teacher Partnership will also fund new benches around the playground.	£11,000
SP1806	St. Columba Church	Strathmartine	To replace and install a new kitchen in the community hall to meet with current health and safety regulations. This will benefit the range of community groups that regularly use it.	£6,000
SP1807	St Mary's Community Facility LMG	Strathmartine	To contribute to the cost of installing two new boilers to replace the old obsolete system. The new boilers can be connected to the underfloor heating already installed, which will benefit all users of the building.	£8,969
WE1805	City Church Dundee	West End	To fund food, equipment, and daily newspapers for The Bridge, a weekly drop-in facility for those in need of support and a hot meal. Other agencies are available at the drop-in to offer support to the 30-40 people attending each session.	£1,569
WE1806	West End Christmas Group (WE Community Council)	West End	To contribute to the West End Christmas Fortnight activities, including promotion and publicity for a series of events for families & children, and for two Christmas lights switch on events in the area with a firework display and concert. A total of 2,000 are expected to participate in these activities.	£2,900
