C1913	Gilfillan Church Drop in Café	Coldside	To fund 6 months running costs for a drop-in community café, providing hot food, support and advice to people from Coldside as well as other area's in the city. Although based in Maryfield, a high number of Coldside Residents attend the drop-in.	£770
C1914	The Haven	Coldside	To fund a new cooker for the café which supports local people with mental ill health. They cater to 75 people per week and the café provides income to the project in order to provide other resources and activities.	£1,445
CP1901	Lily Walker Centre Garden	Coldside	To contribute towards the creation of a therapy garden space for those who are resident in the Lily Walker Centre. More than 400 people who are going through homelessness and the issues that can come with it will benefit.	£10,000
EE1916	Community Food Hub	East End	To provide a fridge to enable the setting up of a weekly food larder at the Hub. The Food Hub will hand out bags of food to 50 members each week for a small fee, provide recipes and healthy cooking demos based on the ingredients available, and a Money Advice Worker will be available to support members as required.	£299
EE1917	Hub Women's Group	East End	To fund resources and an upholsterer tutor to deliver sessions to the group of 8 local women, where they will learn upcycling skills to then pass on to other members of the community.	£600
EEP1902	City Development, DCC	East End	To create at least 32 new parking spaces and greatly improve the local landscape to build on and complement the work taking place on Balunie Avenue.	£27,234
EEY1910	Douglas Library, LACD	East End	The grant would be used to set up a two weekly war games project with the after school club. The funds will be used to buy a 3D printer to print war games characters, model paints, brushes and glues to create figures. This will benefit 10 local children.	£527
F1906	Broughty Ferry Outdoors Type	The Ferry	To fund signwriting and environmental murals at Queens Street Car Park and Campfield Square to improve the areas for the whole community. The Queen street site will be developed in partnership with young people involved with Grove Academy Eco Group and the Princes Trust.	£1,438
L1924	Phoenix Association	Lochee	To fund the purchase of equipment for Whorterbank Community Garden, to build a fence around the raspberry hedgerow, tools, seeds, plants, enviro-mesh, Garden wigwams and a BBQ for the whole community to benefit from.	£1,232

Additional funding has been agreed in order to reduce the subscription fee to 50p per day per family.	£2,196
L1926	Dundee Voluntary Action	Lochee	To cover staff costs for the Lochee Community Hub from November to December, while awaiting approval on long-term funding bids. The Community Hub is there for the benefit of the whole community.	£3,413
L1927	Love Lochee – Santa's Grotto and Planter Plaques	Lochee	This group will provide a free Santa's Grotto for the whole community on 7 th and 14 th December, which will provide a free gift for each child, arts and crafts activities, music and entertainment. The grant will fund lights and decorations and selection boxes. The group have adopted the planters in Lochee High Street and this will also fund Christmas lights and plaques for the planters.	£1,091
L1928	West End Makers and Bakers	Lochee	This grant will fund a free Christmas Light Night for the community of Lochee, including arts and crafts, face painter, refreshments, street entertainer, photo props, bunting, publicity, road closure, insurance, small gifts for children and glow sticks	£1,396
NEY1911	DD4 Pipes & Drums	North East	Formation of a Community Youth Pipe Band. Funding snacks for approximately 90 pupils during practice sessions and for uniform and equipment costs to support the branding of the group.	£2,100
NEY1912	Fintry and Friends Out Of School Care Club	North East	To fund staffing and resources costs for a Happy Minds Children and Family Club. There is an opportunity for family learning within the group. This is a partnership between this club and Discoverin' Families, who will carry out the outreach, while this club will deliver and facilitate the sessions. Volunteers as well as families made up of 15 children and 24 adults have been identified to participate.	£2,676
S1916	Circle Scotland CIC	Strathmartine	To fund the purchase a commercial oven, microwave, bain marie and new cups & crockery for the café at The Circle which will provide employment to 6 young people who have been through the care system, providing training and supporting them in managing a job. The café also offers a community space for the local community to come along and use.	£1,984
S1918	Ardler Complex Local Management Group	Strathmartine	To fund spring flower bulbs to enhance the general area for. Ardler Environment Group are made up of volunteers who maintain the environment around the Ardler Complex for the benefit of the whole community.	£304

SY1909	St Paul's Academy	Strathmartine	Miss Fits Girls Activities Group. This Group provide free extra-curricular sports and physical activity clubs for young female pupils. The grant will fund free sessions at Ryze, Foxlake, McTaggart Gymnastics, Yoga, fitness sessions for up to 457 group members and the purchase of t-shirts and hoodies for members & young volunteers.	£1,665
