The Law has recently been awarded a Green Flag, however, the state of this building has been commented on unfavourably in the past. The whole community of visitors will benefit from this funding.	£1,500
C1909	Coldside Community Forum, supporting Dundee Graffiti Jam	Coldside	Funds will pay for boards and base coat paint to prepare walls to allow over 40 artists from Dundee and all over the world to paint street art in the Coldside Community, brightening up the areas for the community and bringing creativity up the Hilltown.	£1,400
C1910	Friends of Dudhope Park	Coldside	To fund a Free Family Fun Day in Dudhope Park with fun activities and opportunities for people to get involved in the local park. This will be advertised to local people with a targeted leaflet drop to 2,000 homes.	£1,859
C1911	Coldside Library	Coldside	To furnish the community area of the newly refurbished Coldside Library. At least 25 people per week will use the space and it will encourage more people into the library.	£1,388
C1912	Main Street Play Group	Coldside	To purchase quality resources to replace damaged toys for educational and fun activities for 10 families in the local community to use each week.	£1,634
EEP1901	Craigiebank Sheltered Housing Complex	East End	To fund the installation of patio doors and a ramp with handrails to improve access to and from the sheltered housing lounge for 114 tenants and their families and friends, and to further enhance the recent garden refurbishment.	£14,300
EEP1903	Neighbourhood Services, Environment Division	East End	To build on and complement the refurbishment and extended existing play area at Finlathen Park, specifically the installation of fencing and gates, with soft landscaping and seating.	£25,000
L1920	Dryburgh Community Association	Lochee	To fund a free summer trip to East Link Family Park for 20 local children, with entrance fee, coach and all food for the day including ice cream. Also a Christmas Pantomime trip for 20 children including tickets, bus and selection boxes each.	£1,160
L1921	Lochee Parish Church	Lochee	To fund the drop in community café, covering utilities, food and cleaning material and promotional flyers for 300 people throughout the year. They will also run free 6 week healthy, budget cooking classes throughout the year, including starter packs and participants expenses for around 50 people.	£2,303
L1922	Menziesshill Parish Church	Lochee	To fund catering equipment, catering costs and food supplies for the Menziesshill Countdown to Christmas event, following on from the very successful event last year to which 500 local people attended.	£582

NEP1901	Finmill Centre LMG	North East	Refurbishment of Ladies toilets including the upgrade of toilet cubicles, flooring, paint and child safety upgrades and also installing new flooring in the main foyer and corridor. This will upgrade the building for around 500 centre users each week.	£7,256
S1914	SMILE Newsletter	Strathmartine	To fund the printing, admin and delivery costs associated with producing 1700 copies of three editions of the local newsletter for residents of St Mary's and Brackens area. The newsletter contains information on local services and events in the area.	£1,860
S1915	Ardler Golden Oldies Cinema Club	Strathmartine	The monthly cinema club is run at Ardler Complex for around 25 local older people at an affordable cost. Films shown are aimed at their generation and refreshments are given at the interval. The grant will cover publicity, volunteer expenses, a Christmas celebration and engagement event including catering, tableware and small prizes.	£450
S1917	Kirkton Community Centre LMG	Strathmartine	To fund a glass fronted fridge, chest freezer, banner, pop up stand, posters and flyers for a new joint venture with Kirkton Partnership to help local people tackling food poverty issues by creating the Kirkton Larder, allowing around 60 participants to purchase bags of fresh & frozen food for a nominal £2 weekly fee.	£1,675
