1. Glyn welcomed everyone to the meeting.

2. Introductions and Apologies

Introductions were made and apologies given.

3. Previous Minutes

Previous Minutes were agreed as a true and accurate record.

4. Matters Arising

Ulverston Sheltered Housing – Update provided by Amy Campbell – DCC Housing Rep – Improvements are almost complete with minor snagging left to do.

St Leonard Park – SUDS Initiative – Scottish Water – Update provided by DCC, City Development. Dundee City Council and Scottish Water are committed to this project. The project is currently at the feasibility stage and design options are being assessed. As part of the feasibility process cost estimates are being undertaken and this will determine how much funding will be required to deliver the project. There are plans for further consultation with local community groups as the project progresses.

5. Emotional Health & Wellbeing, Children & Young People - Together to Thrive

Glyn introduced Dominc Venditozzi to the members of the LCPP.

Dominic explained his role and the background to the Together to Thrive initiative.

This is a partnership including the 3rd Sector, Health and Communities with the aim of improving mental health amongst young people across Dundee whilst reducing referrals to CAMHS (Child & Adolescent Mental Health Services) by adopting a preventative approach.

6. Local Community Plan – Deep Dive – What Matters to You

Discussion around What Matters to You. A series of meetings with identified partners have been held in Kirkton C. Good attendance at the meetings. A programme of family activities is being planned by the Strathmartine Community Empowerment Team with funding support from What Matters to You.

Geoff Leask – What Matters to You – Explained the concept of What Matters to You and the Values Based Leadership Experience residential opportunity and invited members of the LCPP to attend as valued community leaders for Strathmartine.

7. Kirkton – Community Safety & Justice Working Group

Meeting held with residents of Ulverston Sheltered Housing Complex to discuss ongoing issues around community safety.

Community Safety Walkabout proposed by Lewis Duncan - Scottish Fire Rescue Service

Working Group to continue to meet.

8. Kirkton MUGA (Multi Use Games Arena)

CRF application for £55,000 Physical & Environmental monies approved by the Strathmartine Community Regeneration Forum. Work due to begin in June. The Muga will be built on the greenspace behind Asda Kirkton.

9. Kirkton Community Centre – Community Engagement

Kirkton Local Management Group are in discussions with the University of Dundee to conduct a joint community engagement exercise with the Kirkton Community. This would involve an Architect and a Designer working with the LMG. Funding is currently being sought for the project.
