The maintenance of the road asset owned by the council is the corporate responsibility of The Road Maintenance Partnership of City Development.



This guide provides an outline of the services provided, together with contacts for customers with any queries relating to the service.

Dundee City Road Network

- 580km of roads
- 1,050km of footways and footpaths
- 25,000 road and footway drainage gullies
- 30,000 items of street furniture

Trunk Roads are the responsibility of the Scottish Government and Transport Scotland and are presently managed and maintained by Amey Infrastructure Services. This includes all winter maintenance operations associated with these assets.

The partnership team

The partnership team is a combination of Dundee City Council road maintenance staff and Tayside Contracts operational staff.

By delivering road maintenance services in partnership, The Partnership are able to provide efficiencies in service delivery and value by effectively managing the deployment of works activities under a combined control remit.

Our operational activities are delivered from the Fairmuir Depot on Clepington Road by an experienced workforce of 65 road workers.



Outline of key services provided by the partnership *(owned Council assets)*

- Inspections, investigations and surveys on Road Assets
- Maintenance of roads
- Maintenance of footways
- Road network management
- Provision of winter maintenance services
- Emergency response to road and footway defects
- Gully cleansing and maintenance
- Maintenance of road markings
- Maintenance of non illuminated signs
- Renewal of street name plates
- Maintenance of pedestrian guardrails
- Maintenance of vehicle restraint system barriers
- Maintenance of low height retaining walls (<1.2m)
- Maintenance of life saving equipment adjacent to the River Tay
- Disabled bays & tourist signs

Outline of services not provided by the partnership *City Development, Transportation Team*

- Traffic signals
- Parking enforcement and public car parks
- Installation of new dropped kerb accesses
- Road Safety and yellow road markings

Environmental Services

- Landscaping, weed control and grass cutting
- Street furniture (including statues and public realm)
- Unmade footpaths and car parks e.g. within parks or cemeteries
- Unmade sections of Green Circular cycle route
- Play parks
