What is the description of the policy, procedure or strategy?	 Reviewing the criteria for individual access to free gardening service to support the aim of adopting a 'person-centred' approach to the delivery of services. Ensuring that limited resources available are better targeted to those most in need.
What is the intended outcome of this policy, procedure or strategy?	Current provision is limited to those in receipt of all levels of Disability Living Allowance (DLA) who do not have the support of adult family members to tend their gardens and to all over 70 years of age. Effectively this means that an informal waiting list for this provision has developed and the existing criteria excludes those who may not be eligible for DLA but who may struggle to maintain their gardens. The report aims to: • Continue a free service for those on middle and higher rates of DLA who don't have family support to tend their gardens. • To offer an independent medical examination to access the need for gardening support for those who are on lower level of DLA and who don't have family support to tend their gardens. • To allow those on other disability related benefits such as Employment Support Allowance, Attendance Allowance, Employment and Support Allowance, Incapacity Allowance etc. and who don't have family support to tend their gardens to apply for the service. • A phased increase in the automatic entitlement from 70 to 75 years the age. Future applicants will be offered an independent medical examination if aged 70 years and over to access their need for gardening support.
