# <u>Dundee City Council Minutes Index - September 1745 - September 1746</u>

This Index will be of particular interest in considering the reaction of the Council to the 1745 Jacobite rebellion. As no page numbers are present in the minutes the dates of the entries concerned are logged in the index.
