

CINEMAS ACT 1985 CONDITIONS

Terms, Conditions and Restrictions applicable to the foregoing Licence

I ACCOMMODATION

1. (a) The number of persons seated in any part of the auditorium shall not exceed the number specified below relative to such part of the auditorium:-

Part of Auditorium	Number of Persons
(b) Patrons may stand in the auditorium only in the places and within the numbers specified below:	
Part of Auditorium and Place	Number of Persons

The area within which standing is allowed shall be clearly defined and the permitted number of persons shall be clearly marked in a conspicuous position within such place.

- (c) Invalids may be permitted to sit in the auditorium in invalid chairs other than petrol driven invalid chairs only with the consent of the City Council and on such conditions as the City Council may determine.
- (d) When any part of the auditorium is full the licensee shall cause a notice to that effect to be exhibited at each pay-box at the entrance to such part.

II STRUCTURE ETC OF PREMISES

- Structural alterations or alterations contrary to these terms, conditions and restrictions or to the
 plan relative to the licence shall not be made during the period of the licence without the
 sanction in writing of the City Council. Before any alterations of any kind are made the
 licensee shall submit full particulars and, if required, a plan in duplicate to the City Council for
 approval.
- 3. All scenery, decorations, borders, drapery, gauze-cloths, curtains and any similar hangings shall be of such material or so treated and maintained that they will not readily catch fire. Paper decorations, not being entirely and directly affixed to the surface of walls or ceilings, shall not be used in any part of the premises unless rendered and maintained fire-resisting. Cotton wool shall not be used for scenery or decorations, whether or not treated with a fire-resisting solution. Any temporary proscenium erected shall be of non-inflammable material and approved by the City Council.
- 4. Every coal, gas and electric fire in any part of the premises to which the public are admitted shall be adequately and security guarded:

- 5. A metal box with a close fitting self-closing lid shall be provided for film cuttings and shall be emptied daily and the cuttings removed.
- 6. The surface of stair treads used by the public shall be of a non-slip or other safe material and the edges of the treads shall where necessary be made and maintained conspicuous by painting or other means to the satisfaction of the City Council.
- 7. Every door in the premises for use by members of the public as an exit shall, while the public are within the premises, be capable of being opened easily and fully by hand pressure and no such door shall be of a revolving or sliding type. Every collapsible gate shall be locked in a fully open position while the public are within the premises.
- The City Council shall in the event of the premises becoming unsafe be entitled to suspend or revoke this licence and where possible reasonable notice of each revocation or suspension thereof shall be given to the licensee.
- 9. (a) Subject as hereinafter provided the licensee, as and when required by the City Council, shall arrange for an inspection of the ceilings by an expert to be carried out in presence of a technical officer of the City Council.
 - (b) Should no such inspection be undertaken within five years from the date of the last inspection such an inspection shall be specially carried out before the expiry of such period.
 - The City Council may require inspections to be made at more frequent intervals in special cases where because of the age of the building or otherwise the City Council are of opinion that faults may develop.
 - (d) After any such inspection has been made a certificate in the following form shall be submitted to the City Council:

- 10. Repairs to the electrical installation or equipment other than urgent minor repairs shall not be carried out in the projection or rewinding rooms while the public are on the premises.
- 11. The electrical installation within the premises shall be inspected between 1 September and 30 November in each year and a certificate in the following form shall be submitted to the City Council on or before 1 December in each year.

- (a) The value of insulation resistance to earth is not less than megohms.
- (b) The earthmoving of the installation is satisfactory except as stated below.
- (c) All flexible conductors, switches, fuses, plugs and socket outlets are in good serviceable condition except as stated below.
- (d) There is no sign of overloading of conductors or accessories except as stated below.

III EXHIBITION OF FILMS

- 12. Except with the approval of the City Council and on such conditions as the City Council may determine any film, other than a current newsreel, shall not be exhibited unless it has received a "12", "15", "18", "U" or "PG" certificate.
- 13. Except with the approval of the City Council and on such conditions as the City Council may determine any person apparently under the age of 18 years shall not be admitted to any exhibition at which there is to be shown any film which has not received an "18" certificate from the British Board of Film Censors.
- 14. Notwithstanding the conditions hereinbefore contained, a film may be exhibited, or persons or any class of persons, may be admitted thereto if the permission of the City Council is first obtained and any conditions of such permission are observed.
- 15. A representation or written statement of the terms of any certificate given by the British Board of Film Censors shall be shown on the screen immediately before the showing of any film to which it relates and the representation or statement shall be shown for long enough and in a form large enough for it to be read from any seat in the auditorium.
- 16. There shall be prominently exhibited at each public entrance whenever the premises are open to the public a notice indicating in tabular form and in clear bold letters and figures:-
 - (a) The title of each film to be shown on that date, other than trailers and films of less than five minutes duration:
 - (b) the approximate times of commencement of each such film;
 - (c) whether each such film has received a "12", "15", "18", "U" or "PG" certificate from the British Board of Film Censors; and
 - (d) the meaning of such "12", "15", "18" or "PG" or "U" certificates.
- 17. The nature of any certificate received in respect of a film from the British Board of Film Censors shall be clearly indicated by the letter "12", "15", "18", "U" or "PG" in any advertisement of the film displayed at the premises.
- 18. No advertisement displayed at the premises of a film to be exhibited at the premises shall depict as a scene or incident in the film any scene or incident which is not included in the film as certified by the British Board of Film Censors or approved for exhibition by the City Council, as the case may be.
- 19. Where the City Council have given notice in writing to the licensee of the premises objecting to an advertisement on the ground that, if displayed, it would offend against good taste or decency or be likely to encourage or incite to crime or to lead to disorder or to be offensive to public feeling that advertisement shall not be displayed at the premises.
- 20. Where the City Council have given notice in writing to the licensee of the premises prohibiting the exhibition of a film on the ground that it contains matter which, if exhibited, would offence against good taste or decency or would be likely to encourage or incite to crime or to lead to disorder or to be offensive to public feeling, that film shall not be exhibited in the premises.

IV GENERAL

- 21. Except with the special permission of the City Council the premises hereby licensed shall not be open to the public for any purpose on any Sunday at any time or on any lawful day before 8 am or continue open later than 11 pm.
- 22. All exit doors shall be opened at the close of each performance or where the performances are continuous at the close of the last performance.
- 23. A sufficient number of fire appliances shall be provided and thereafter maintained and situated all to the satisfaction of the City Council and the instruction of the licensee and other persons in the protection of the premises against fire, the use of fire appliances and the method of summoning Tayside Fire and Rescue shall be carried out to the satisfaction of the City Council. While the public are on the premises there shall always be on duty at least one member of the staff other than the licensee or the operators who has received such instruction.
- 24. The licensee shall maintain, and assist in maintaining, good order and decency and shall not, by himself or his servant, knowingly permit unsuitable persons to enter the premises as spectators or in any other capacity and shall not permit any promenade of the spectators or audience to take place with in the premises or any part thereof. Should any disorder take place, the licensee shall by himself and his servants assist to the utmost in the arrest or expulsion of the offenders.
- 25. Each attendant on duty in the premises shall wear a distinctive dress or arm-band.
- 26. Any person in a state of intoxication shall not be permitted to enter or remain in the premises.
- 27. The licensee shall arrange that persons obliged to stand in the premises shall, as far as possible, get a seat in due order.
- 28. There shall be provided and maintained in the premises to the satisfaction of the City Council suitable, sufficient and separate sanitary conveniences and lavatory facilities for each sex so situated as to be reasonably accessible for the persons for whom they are intended. The rooms within which such conveniences and facilities are provided and the whole fittings, fixtures and furniture thereof shall be kept in a clean and hygienic condition to the satisfaction of the City Council.
- 29. The premises shall be adequately ventilated and maintained at a reasonable temperature to the satisfaction of the City Council.
- 30. The whole premises and the fittings, furniture and furnishings therein shall be cleaned regularly and shall be kept clean and in good repair all to the satisfaction of the City Council.
- 31. The licensee shall be liable for any act committed by or omission of his servants in contravention of any of these conditions.
- 32. It shall be competent for the City Council at any time during the currency of the licence to add to, dispense with, modify or suspend any of the foregoing terms, conditions and restrictions and in the event of failure to comply with any of them the City Council shall be entitled to suspend or revoke the licence.
