


## **Broughty Ferry Waterfront**

## Broughty Ferry Waterfront



## **Directions**

Start opposite Broughty Ferry Library on Queen Street. Walk along Queen Street and take the next road on your left and walk down Fort Street. At the end of Fort Street turn left and walk along Fisher Street and Beach Crescent, past the waterfront and towards the harbour. When you reach the Harbour turn left up St Vincent Street. Walk up St Vincent Street, cross under the railway line, and then turn left onto Queen Street. Walk back to Broughty Ferry Library.

## Points of interest

- 115 Fisher Street used to have a Negretto & Zambia
   1859 barometer in its wall.
- There are lots of 19th C seaside villas on Beach Crescent.
- Fisher Street dates from when fishermen lived there.
- Broughty Castle was built on a tidal island at the end
  of the 15th century. By the mid-18th century, it was
  abandoned, and going to ruin. The War Office restored it
  in 1861 as a coastal battery, to defend the mouth of the Tay.
- St Vincent Street is named after the famous sea battle.
- Broughty Ferry railway station is one of the oldest in Scotland.
