# Your NEW Recycling Service

More residents of Dundee will be able to recycle more materials, more easily when the 2nd phase of the city council's enhanced recycling services is launched on 9th November.

Dundee City Council is rolling-out changes across the city over the next two years in order to increase recycling and meet the requirements of the Waste (Scotland) Regulations.

Phase 1 of 6, launched in March, has been very successful – areas included parts of West End, Broughty Ferry, Dryburgh & Gowrie Park. Recycling rates in these areas are now almost double that of the city-wide rate.

#### Phase 2 will launch on 9th November Areas of the city included in Phase 2 are:

- Menzieshill
- Brook St (West End)
  Blackness Rd (East)
- CharlestonLochee (West)
- Peddie St
- Tullideph
- Pentland
- City Road
- HawkhillSouth Tay St
  - Windsor St

#### All households in Phase 2 areas will shortly receive a teaser postcard advising them of the forthcoming changes & listing the roadshow dates in their area where they can see the food waste bins and speak to members of staff for more information on the changes.

Environment convener Councillor Craig Melville said: "The council is working to make sure that local residents will have as much information as possible before the changes are introduced.

"Roadshows will be part of a campaign supported by letters and leaflets that will be sent to residents across the areas in the roll out. I would encourage people to come along and ask questions at the roadshows about any aspect of the improved service."

#### The new recycling service includes:

- Food waste: Collected every week.
- **Blue bins:** Increased range of materials accepted in blue bins. This is currently used for paper & card but will accept plastics & metal. **Collected every 2 weeks**.
- Burgundy bin for mixed glass. Collected every 4 weeks.
- General waste moves from weekly to collected every 2 weeks.
- Expanded assisted collection service now available for blue & burgundy bin collections.
- Garden waste service. No change.

## Flatted properties will be individually assessed to determine the most suitable container types and collection methods. Uplifts for flats using shared bins may be more frequent.

Anyone who doesn't currently have a blue bin and would like to order one, or who uses a slimline bin and would like to upgrade to a larger bin, can do so by contacting the Environment Department. (please see contact details below).
