Sarah discussed some new data pulled from the recent consultations in Baldragon and St Pauls RC with the LCPP.

Alcohol & Drugs Partnership Round 2 Funding - £12,000

Strathmartine Projects which received funding:

Ardler Primary School – Amount awarded £2300

Funding was used to purchase to provide support for children living in households affected by substance use or for parents affected by substance use. The school used the funds to develop a family garden in the school playground, a sensory space in the school for children and to develop a parents drop in. The drop in was developed as a safe space where parents can share concerns, obtain advice and take part in activities.

St Andrews Primary School – Amount awarded - £3830

Funding was used to support vulnerable children attend trips, buy resources for working with children displaying difficult behaviours and to support a group of mothers who have children who attend St Andrews Primary School.

Sidlawview Primary School – Amount Awarded £2000

Funds were used to establish a programme of support and activities for a group of young mothers. The school had identified that the group were either using substances or were at risk of exploitation. The funds have enabled the School & Family Development Worker to develop a positive working relationship with the parents. The group took part in pampering sessions, hairdressing and fitness activities.

Downfield Mains Church – Amount Awarded £300

Funding was used to develop a wellbeing project aimed at pupils who had engaged in antisocial behaviour in the community. This was run in partnership with the School & Family Development Worker of Downfield Primary.

Downfield Juniors Football Club – Amount Awarded £2401

Funding was used to develop a space within the football ground which is accessed by a recovery group. The group is a peer support group made up of community members from Kirkton. The football club wanted to use ADP funds to make a recovery friendly space in their facility which would provide a more welcoming and friendly environment.

St Marys Community Centre – Amount Awarded £2000

Funding was used to pay for a qualified Counsellor to deliver a mixture of one to one and groupwork counselling sessions from St Marys Community Centre. The NHS Keep Well Nurse and CLD community workers based in St Marys referred community members to the counselling sessions.
