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## 1. Introduction

This profile report is for the Strathmartine Local Community Planning Partnership (LCPP)/ Ward and its community areas. The report presents statistical information from the 2020 Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation (SIMD).

The SIMD is the Scottish Governments official tool for identifying places in Scotland suffering from deprivation. The 2020 SIMD was originally published on 28th January 2020. After identifying an error data used to compile the SIMD, the Scottish Government published a revised version of the 2020 SIMD in June 2020.






This document reports on the SIMD 2020 data published in June 2020. Where available, data is broken down to community areas within LCPP/Wards to allow differences within each community area to be highlighted.

The Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation (SIMD) is the Scottish Governments official tool for identifying places in Scotland suffering from deprivation. Deprivation in this context refers to the range of problems that arise due to the lack of resources or opportunities covering health, safety, education, employment, housing, access to services and financial aspects.

- Scotland is split into 6,976 small areas, called 'data zones', with roughly equal population.
- The Scottish Government looked at indicators to measure the different sides of deprivation in each data zone, like pupil performance, travel times to the GP, crime, unemployment and many others.
- These 38 indicators of deprivation were grouped into 7 types, called 'domains'.
- The 7 domains are combined into one SIMD, ranking each data zone in Scotland from 1 (most deprived) to 6,976 (least deprived).
- Focusing on small areas shows the different issues there are in each neighbourhood. These could be poor housing conditions, a lack of skills or good education, or poor public transport.

The community areas used in this profile document are geographical areas that were developed by Dundee City Council, Neighbourhood Services and they split Dundee City into 54 geographical areas. In the majority of cases the raw data used to populate this profile is only produced at data zone level. Data zones are much larger geographical areas than the community areas meaning that one data zone can be split across multiple community areas and LCPP/Wards. To analyse and display the data at community area level, work is undertaken to proportion out the data zones to assign the relevant parts that fall within each community area and LCPP/Ward.

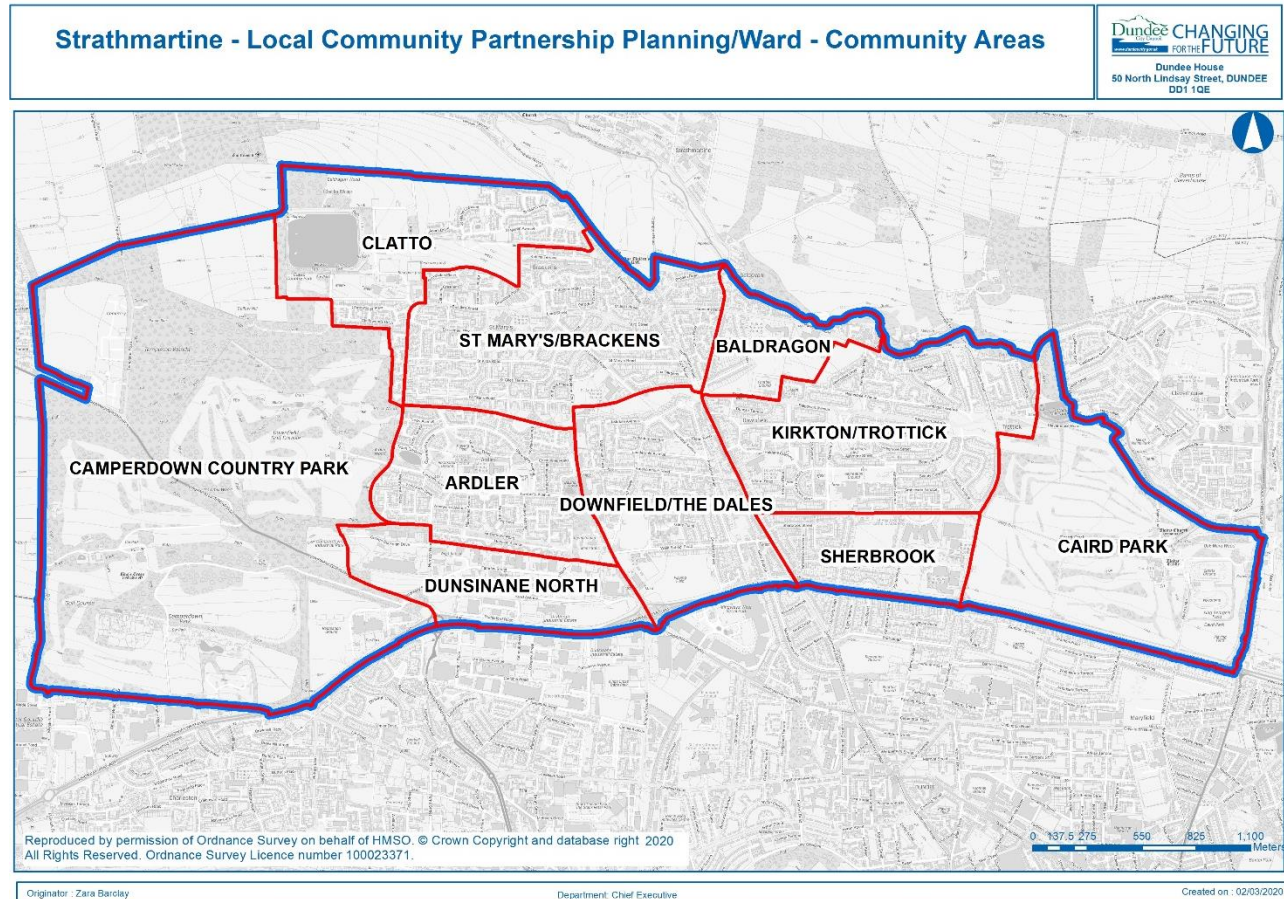

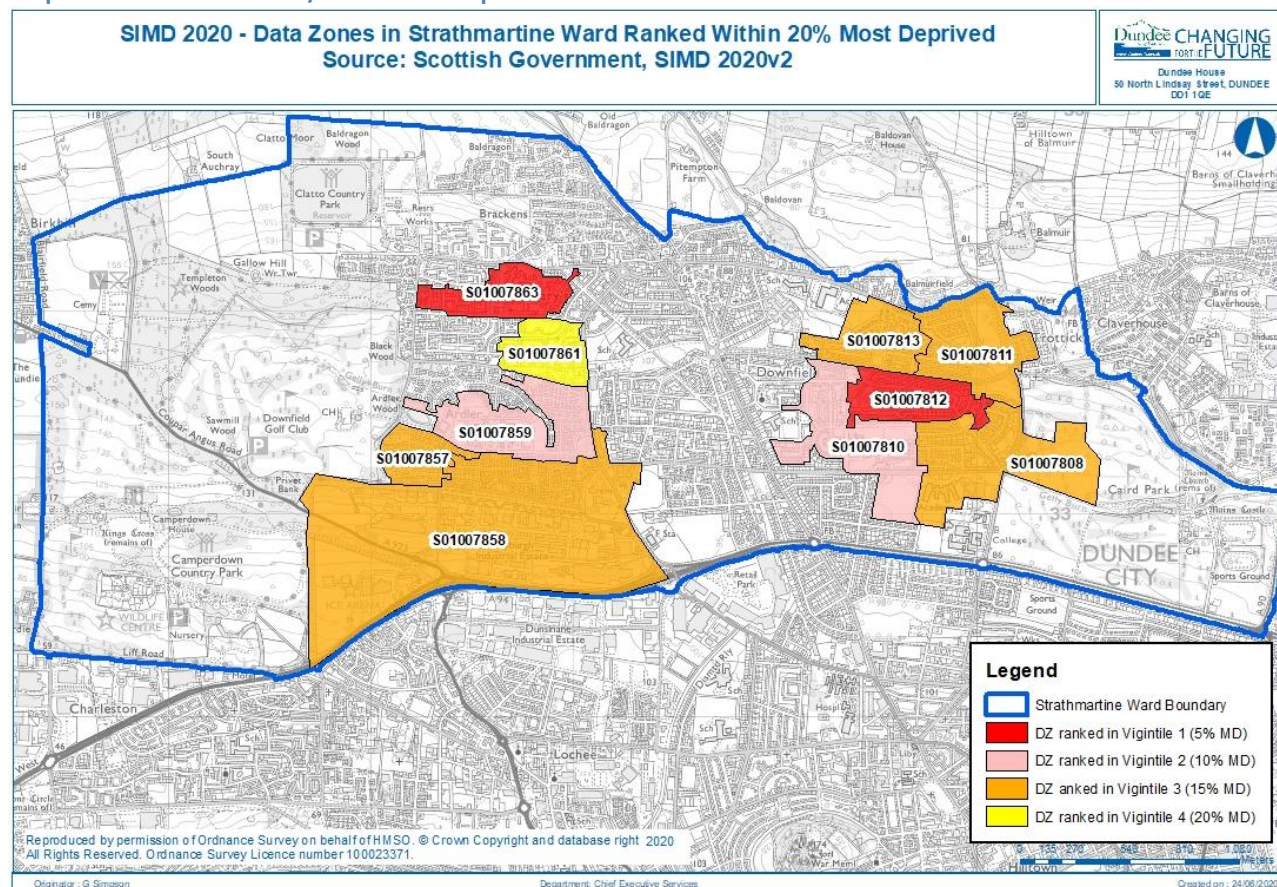

### 3. Strathmartine LCPP/Ward – Data Zones Ranked in the 20% Most Deprived

Map 2 shows the location of data zones in Strathmartine LCPP/ Ward that are ranked in the 20% most deprived data zones as reported in the SIMD 2020.

The above map shows that within Strathmartine LCPP/Ward there are **10 data zones** ranked within the 20% most deprived in the SIMD 2020.

In the SIMD 2016, there were 12 data zones within Strathmartine LCPP/ Ward ranked in the 20% most deprived, this has decreased to 10 in the SIMD 2020. The number of data zones ranked in the 20% most deprived in Dundee City as a whole has increased from 69 in 2016 to 70 in 2020.

## 4. Percentage of the population who live in the 5% and 20% Most Deprived Data Zones

**Table 3** shows the percentage of the population in each community area who live in a data zone that is ranked in the 5% and 20% most deprived in the SIMD 2020. It should be noted that the percentage of the population who live in the 5% most deprived data zones will also be counted within the percentage of the population who live in the 20% most deprived data zones.

The above table shows that Kirkton/Trottick (16.1%), St Mary's/Brackens (14.9%) and Sherbrook (0.3%) are the only community areas within Strathmartine LCPP/Ward that have a proportion of the population living in a data zone ranked in the 5% most deprived.

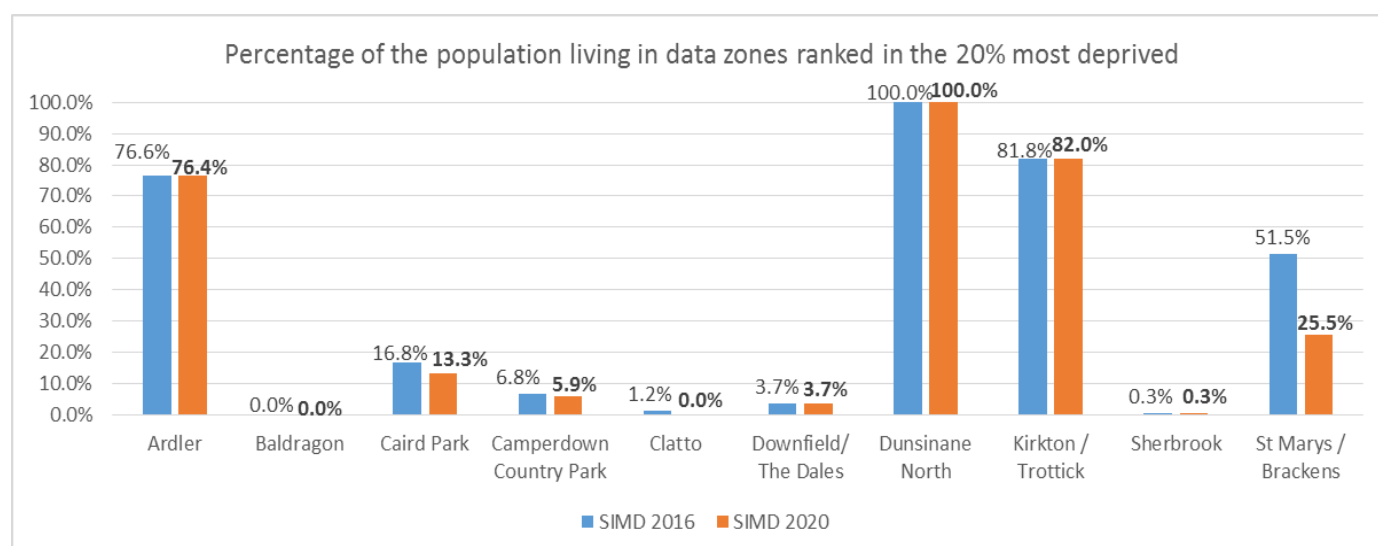
The majority of the population in Dunsinane North (100%), Kirkton/Trottick (82.0%) and Ardler (76.4%), live in a data zone ranked in the 20% most deprived. St Marys/Brackens (25.5%), Caird Park (13.3%), Camperdown Country Park (5.9%), Downfield/The Dales (3.7%), Sherbrook (0.3%) also have a proportion of their respective populations living in data zones ranked in the 20% most deprived. Baldragon and Clatto are the only community areas within Strathmartine LCPP/Ward where 0% of the population live in a data zone ranked in the 20% most deprived.

When comparing the percentage of the population who live in data zones ranked in the 20% most deprived in the 2016 and 2020 SIMD, Baldrigon was the only community area where 0% of the population live in a data zone ranked in the 20% most deprived in both of the SIMD's. In the 2016 SIMD around 1% of the population in Clatto lived in a data zone ranked in the 20% most deprived this has reduced to 0% in the 2020 SIMD.

Decreases in the percentage of the population living in data zones ranked in the 20% most deprived occurred in Ardler, Caird Park, Camperdown Country Park and St Marys/Brackens. The level of the reductions varied across the community areas, St Marys/Brackens experienced the greatest reduction in the percentage of the population living in data zones ranked in the 20% most deprived from 51.5% in 2016 to 25.5% in 2020.

In Kirkton/Trottick the percentage of the population living in data zones ranked in the 20% most deprived increased slightly from 81.8% in 2016 to 82.0% in 2020. The percentage of the population living in data zones ranked in the

20% most deprived in Dunsinane North (100.0%), Downfield/The Dales (3.7%) and Sherbrook (0.3%) remained at the same level in both the 2016 and 2020 SIMD.

**Table 5** shows the percentage of children aged 0-15 years in each of the community areas who live in a data zone that is ranked in the 5% and 20% most deprived in the SIMD 2020. It should be noted that the percentage of children (0-15yrs) who live in the 5% most deprived data zones will also be counted within the percentage of children (0-15yrs) who live in the 20% most deprived data zones.

St Marys/Brackens (21.5%) and Kirkton/Trottick (17.7%) are the only community areas within Strathmartine LCCP/Ward that have a proportion of their 0-15 years population living in data zones ranked in the 5% most deprived.

The majority of children aged 0-15 years in Dunsinane North (100%), Kirkton/Trottick (85.6%) and Ardler (70.6%) live in a data zone that is ranked in the 20% most deprived. Around 33% of children (0-15 years) in Caird Park and St Marys/Brackens live in data zones ranked in the 20% most deprived. A small proportion of the 0-15 years population in Downfield/The Dales (3.4%) live in data zones ranked in the 20% most deprived. In Baldragon, Camperdown Country Park, Clatto and Sherbrook 0% of children aged 0-15 years live in data zones ranked in the 20% most deprived.

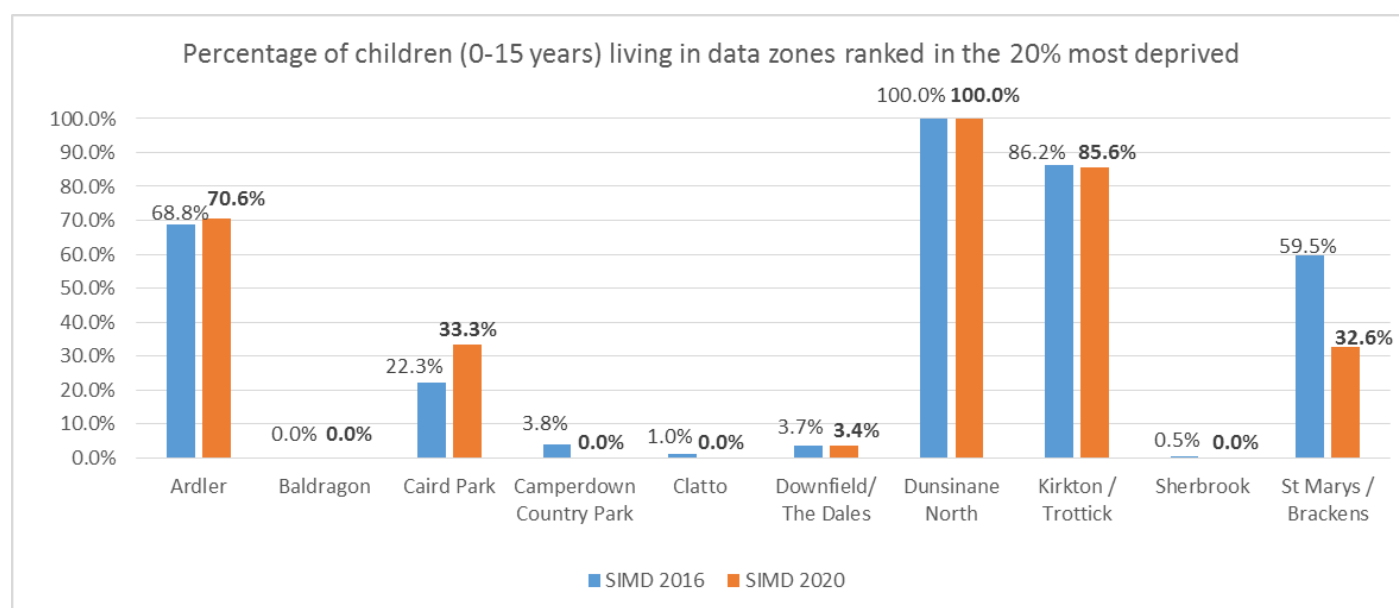

**Table 6** and the above chart show the percentage of children (0-15 years) who live in data zones ranked in the 20% most deprived as reported in the 2016 and 2020 SIMD. Baldragon is the only community area where 0% of children (0-15 years) live in a data zone ranked in the 20% most deprived in both the 2016 and 2020 SIMD.

Ardler is the only community area to experience an increase in the percentage of children aged 0-15 years living in data zones ranked in the 20% most deprived from 68.8% in 2016 to 70.6% in 2020. There has been no change in Dunsinane North with 100% of children (0-15 years) living in data zones ranked in the 20% most deprived.

The remaining community areas namely Caird Park, Camperdown Country Park, Clatto, Downfield/The Dales, Kirkton/Trottick, Sherbrook and St Marys/Brackens all experienced a decrease in the percentage of children (0-15 years) living in data zones ranked in the 20% most deprived. The level of the decrease varied across community areas with St Marys/Brackens experiencing the largest decrease from 59.5% in 2016 to 32.6% in 2020.

## 5. Health Domain

The health domain in the SIMD examines rates of mortality, hospital stays related to alcohol and drug misuse, illness, prescription rates for certain conditions and low birth weights. **Table 7** shows the percentage of the population in each Strathmartine LCPP/Ward community area that live in a data zone ranked within the 20% most health deprived as reported in the 2016 and 2020 SIMD.

The 2020 SIMD found that the majority of those who live in Dunsinane North (100.0%), Kirkton/Trottick (82.0%) and Ardler (58.2%) live in data zones ranked within the 20% most deprived in the health domain. Lower proportions were reported in Caird Park (16.0%), St Marys/Brackens (14.9%), Camperdown Country Park (5.8%), Downfield/The Dales (3.7%) and Sherbrook (0.3%). Baldragon and Clatto are the only community areas within Strathmartine LCPP/Ward where 0% of the population live in a data zone ranked in the 20% most deprived in the health domain.

At an overall Strathmartine LCPP/Ward level 34.9% of the population live in a data zone that is ranked in the 20% most deprived in the health domain. This is lower than the overall Dundee City proportion which stands at 36.6%.

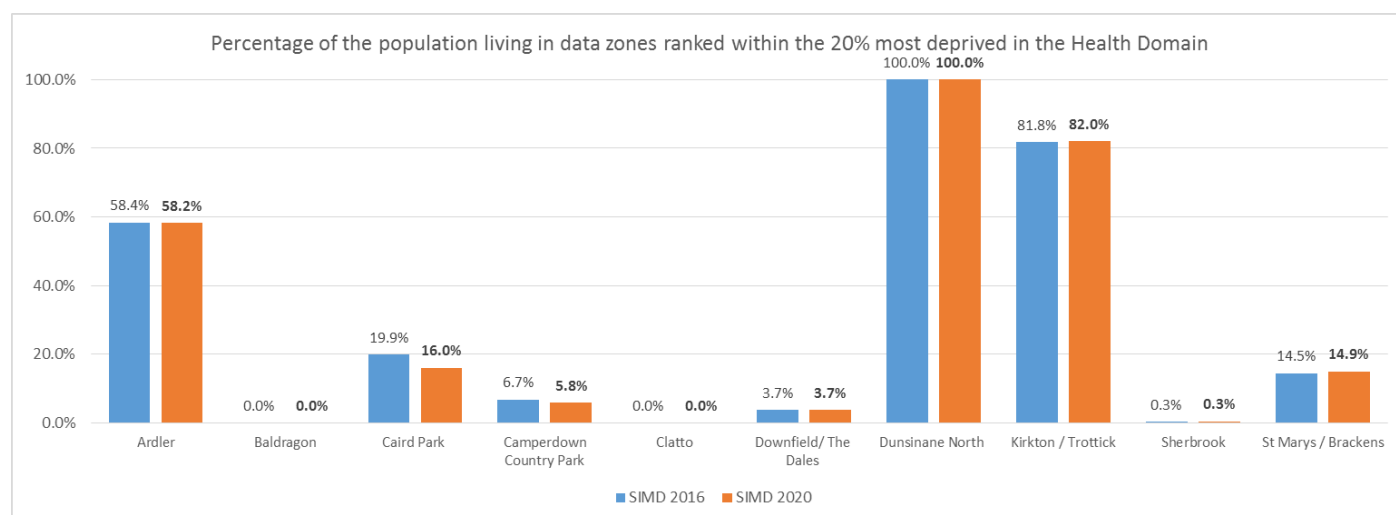

When comparing the 2016 and 2020 SIMD, Baldragon and Clatto are the only community areas in Strathmartine LCPP/Ward where 0% of the population live in data zone ranked in the 20% most deprived in the health domain in both of the SIMDs.

Small increases of less than 0.5%, in the percentage of the population living in data zones ranked in the 20% most deprived in the health domain occurred in Kirkton/Trottick and St Marys/Brackens when comparing the SIMD 2016 and 2020. Decreases however occurred in Ardler, Caird Park and Camperdown Country Park. The largest decrease occurred in Caird Park which reduced from 19.9% in 2016 to 16.0% in 2020.

All of those living in Dunsinane North lived in a data zone ranked in the 20% most deprived in the health domain in both the SIMD 2016 and 2020. There was no change in the percentage in Downfield/The Dales and Sherbrook.

At overall Strathmartine LCPP/Ward level the percentage of the population living in data zones ranked in the 20% most deprived in the health domain increased slightly from 34.6% in 2016 to 34.9% in 2020. An increase also occurred for Dundee City overall from 33.5% in 2016 to 36.6% in 2020.

## 6. Education Domain

The education domain in the Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation examines school absences, pupil performance, working age population with no qualifications, FE/HE education rates and unemployed youths (16-19) not in full time education, employment or training.

**Table 8** shows the percentage of children aged 0-15 years in each Strathmartine LCPP/Ward community area who live in a data zone ranked within the 20% most deprived in the education domain as reported in the SIMD 2016 and 2020.

When looking at the results of the 2020 SIMD, Kirkton/Trottick with 86.8% is the community area which has the greatest proportion of children aged 0-15 years living in a data zone ranked within the 20% most deprived in the education domain. Downfield/The Dales (35.6%), St Marys/Brackens (32.6%), Caird Park (20.4%), Ardler (18.6%) also have a proportion of their 0-15 years population living in data zones ranked in the 20% most deprived in the education domain. In contrast 0% of the 0-15 years population in Baldragon, Camperdown Country Park, Clatto, Dunsinane North and Sherbrook live in a data zone ranked in the 20% most deprived in the education domain.

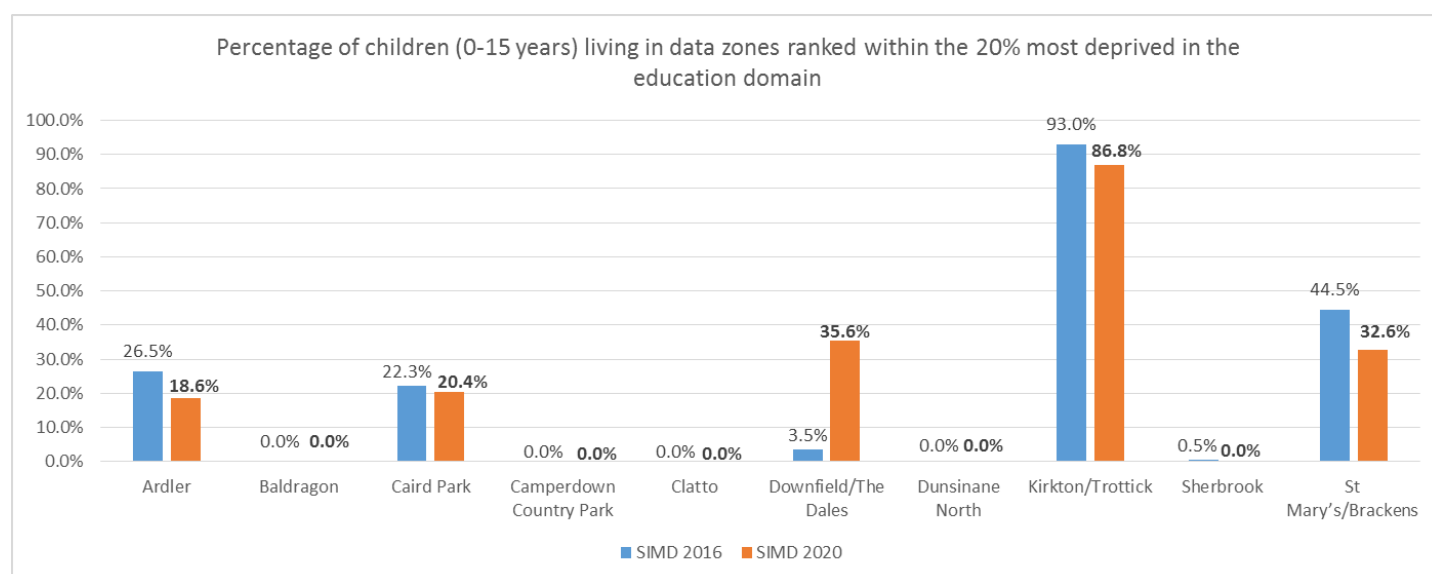
At an overall Strathmartine LCPP/Ward level 44.5% of children aged 0-15 years live in a data zone ranked in the 20% most deprived in the education domain, the figure stands at 47.3% for Dundee City overall.

When comparing the percentage of children aged 0-15 years living in data zones ranked in the 20% most deprived in the education domain in the SIMD 2016 and 2020, Downfield/The Dales is the only community area within Strathmartine LCPP/Ward to experience an increase from 3.5% in 2016 to 35.6% in 2020. There are decreases in Ardler, Caird Park, Kirkton/Trottick, Sherbrook and St Marys/Brackens. The greatest decrease occurred in St Marys/Brackens from 44.5% in 2016 to 32.6% in 2020. In Baldrigon, Camperdown Country Park, Clatto and Dunsinane North 0% of the 0-15 years population live in a data zone ranked in the 20% most deprived in the education domain in both the 2016 and 2020 SIMD.



In Strathmartine LCPP/Ward, the percentage of children aged 0-15 years living in data zones ranked in the 20% most deprived data zones in the education domain reduced from 47.8% in 2016 to 44.5% in 2020. There has been an increase at Dundee City level from 45% in 2016 to 47.3% in 2020.

## 7. Employment Domain

The employment domain in the Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation examines unemployment claimant counts averaged over 12 months, working age incapacity benefit or employment support allowance recipients and working age severe disablement allowance recipients. **Table 9** shows the percentage of the working age population in each community area within Strathmartine LCPP/Ward who live in a data zone that is ranked in the 20% most deprived in the employment domain as reported in the 2016 and 2020 SIMD.

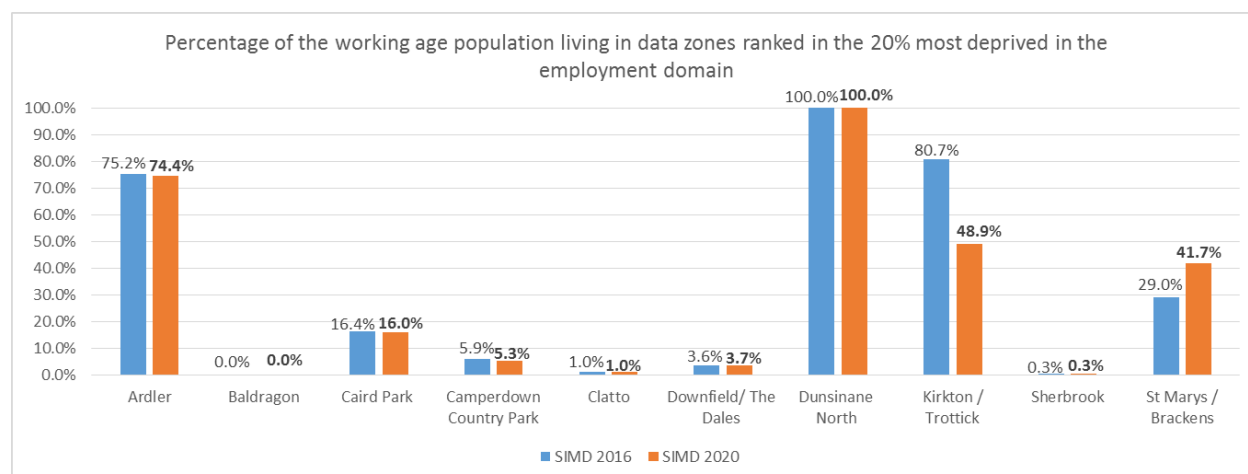
The 2020 SIMD reported that the percentage of the working age population who live in a data zone ranked in the 20% most deprived in the employment domain varies across the community areas. The highest percentages were seen in Dunsinane North (100%) and Ardler (74.4%) whereas 0% of the working age population in Baldragon and Sherbrook live in a data zone that is ranked in the 20% most deprived in the employment domain. Overall in Strathmartine LCPP/Ward, 36.9% of the working age population live in a data zone ranked in the 20% most deprived in the employment domain this is consistent with the overall Dundee City level which stands at 36.4%.

When comparing the 2016 and 2020 SIMD, there was no change in the percentage of the working age population who live in data zones ranked in the 20% most deprived in the employment domain in the Baldragon, Clatto, Dunsinane North and Sherbrook.

Decreases in the percentage of the working age population living in data zones ranked in the 20% most deprived in the employment domain were experienced in Ardler, Caird Park, Camperdown Country Park and Kirkton/Trottick. The greatest decrease is in Kirkton/Trottick where the percentage of the working age population living in data zones ranked in the 20% most deprived in the employment domain reduced from 80.7% in 2016 to 48.9% in 2020. In St Marys/Brackens the percentage of the working age population living in data zones ranked in the 20% most deprived in the employment domain increased from 29.0% in 2016 to 41.7% in 2020. A very small increase also occurred in Downfield/The Dales from 3.6% in 2016 to 3.7% in 2020.

The Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation also provides a count of the number of employment deprived people in each data zone. The number of employment deprived people is a useful measure as it can show the number of individuals who are classed as being employment deprived in data zones that are not ranked in the 20% most deprived. **Table 10** shows the proportion of the working age population who are classed as employment deprived in the SIMD 2016 and 2020.

The 2020 SIMD found that 17.6% of the working age population living in Ardler are classed as employment deprived this is the highest proportion of all the community areas in Strathmartine LCPP/Ward followed by Kirkton/Trottick (16.6%) and St Marys/Brackens (12.4%). At an overall Strathmartine LCPP/Ward level 12.4% of the working age population are classed as employment deprived this is consistent with the overall Dundee City percentage

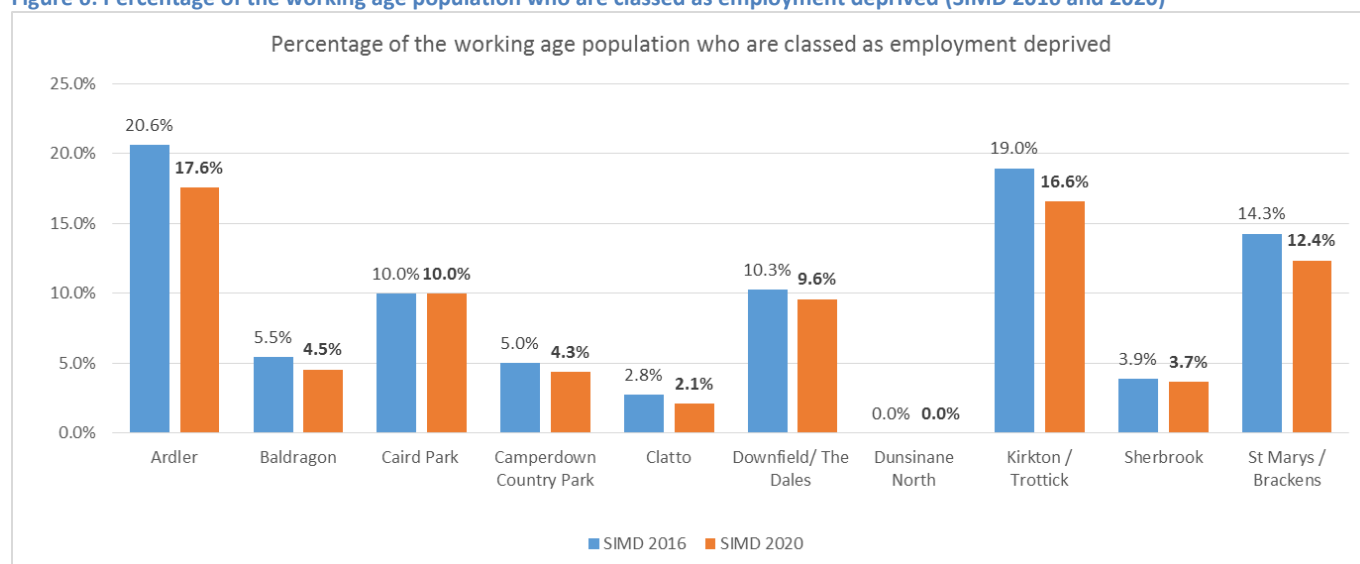

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When comparing the findings of the 2016 and 2020 SIMD, the percentage of the working age population classed as employment deprived in Caird Park (10.0%) and Dunsinane North (0.0%) remained the same in both of the SIMD publications. All of the other community areas within Strathmartine LCPP/Ward experienced a decrease in the percentage of the working age population classed as employment deprived. The greatest decrease was in Ardler where the percentage of the working age population classed as employment deprived reduced from 20.6% in 2016 to 17.6% in 2020.

Overall in Strathmartine LCPP/Ward level the percentage of the working age population classed as employment deprived decreased from 14.2% in 2016 to 12.4% in 2020. A similar reduction was also experienced at a Dundee City level from 14.1% in 2016 to 12.4% in 2020.

## 8. Income Domain

The income domain in the Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation examines adults and children in Income Support or Income-based Employment Support Allowance households, adults in Guarantee Pension Credit Households, adults and children in Job Seekers Allowance households and adults and children in Tax Credit Families.

**Table 11** shows the percentage of the population in each community area within Strathmartine LCPP/Ward who live in a data zone ranked in the 20% most deprived in the income domain as reported in the 2016 and 2020 SIMD.

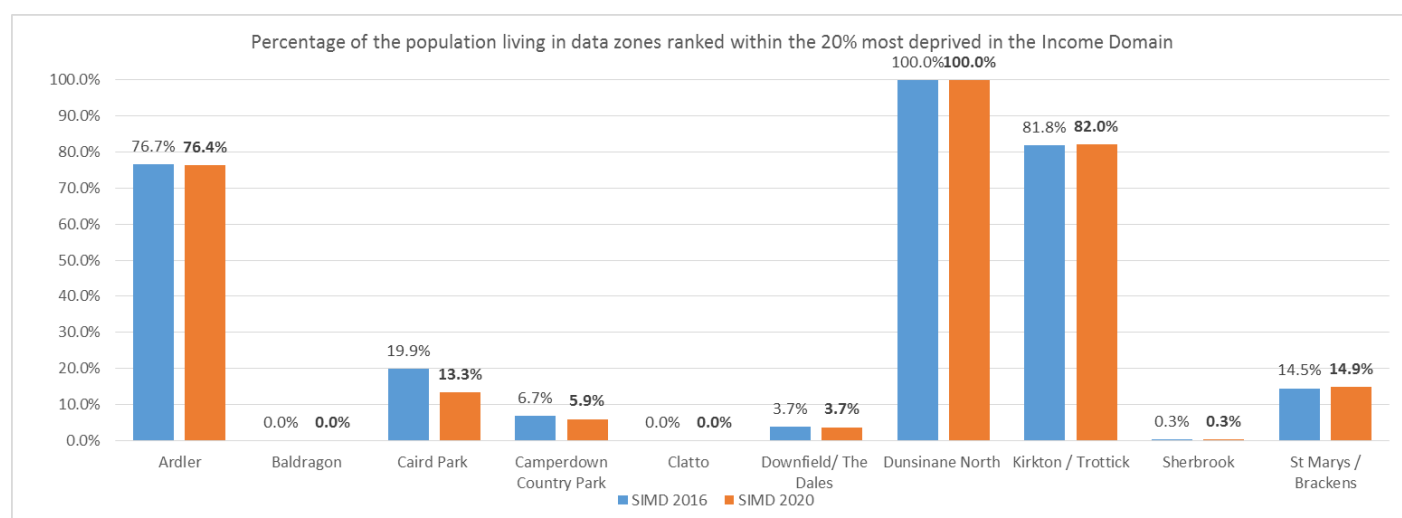
The 2020 SIMD reported that the majority of the population living in Dunsinane North (100%), Kirkton/Trottick (82.0%) and Ardler (76.4%) live in a data zone that is ranked in the 20% most deprived in the income domain. In contrast 0% of the population who live in Baldragon, Clatto and Sherbrook live in a data zone that is ranked in the 20% most deprived in the income domain.

When comparing the SIMD 2016 and 2020, the percentage of the population living in data zones ranked within the 20% most deprived in the income domain remained the same in Baldragon (0%), Clatto (0%), Downfield/The Dales (3.7%), Dunsinane North (100.0%) and Sherbrook (0.3%). Small increases of less than 0.5% were experienced in Kirkton/Trottick and St Mary's/Brackens. Decreases were experienced in Ardler, Caird Park and Camperdown Country Park. The greatest decrease was in Caird Park which reduced from 19.9% in 2016 to 13.3% in 2020.

At overall Strathmartine LCPP/Ward level the percentage of the population living in data zones ranked within the 20% most deprived in the income domain increased very slightly from 37.2% in 2016 to 37.5% in 2020. There was an increase at Dundee City level from 35.7% in 2016 to 36.6% in 2020.

For each data zone the Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation (SIMD) produces a count of individuals classed as income deprived. This is people who are claiming key benefits, children in low income households and families dependant on tax credits.

**Table 12** shows the proportion of the population who are income deprived in each community area as reported in the 2016 and 2020 SIMD. The number of income deprived people is an attempt to identify individuals who are income deprived despite not living in a data zone that is ranked within the 20% most deprived. All of the community areas have individuals classed as income deprived by the SIMD despite some having no population living in data zones ranked in the 20% most deprived.

In the 2020 SIMD, Kirkton/Trottick (25.9%) is the community area within Strathmartine LCPP/Ward which has the greatest proportion of its population classed as income deprived, this is followed by Dunsinane North (25.0%) and Ardler (24.4%). In contrast just under 3% of the population in Camperdown Country Park (2.9%) and Clatto (2.8%) are classed as income deprived. At an overall Strathmartine LCPP/Ward level 17.2% of the population are classed as income deprived, this is greater than the overall Dundee City percentage stands at 16.4%.

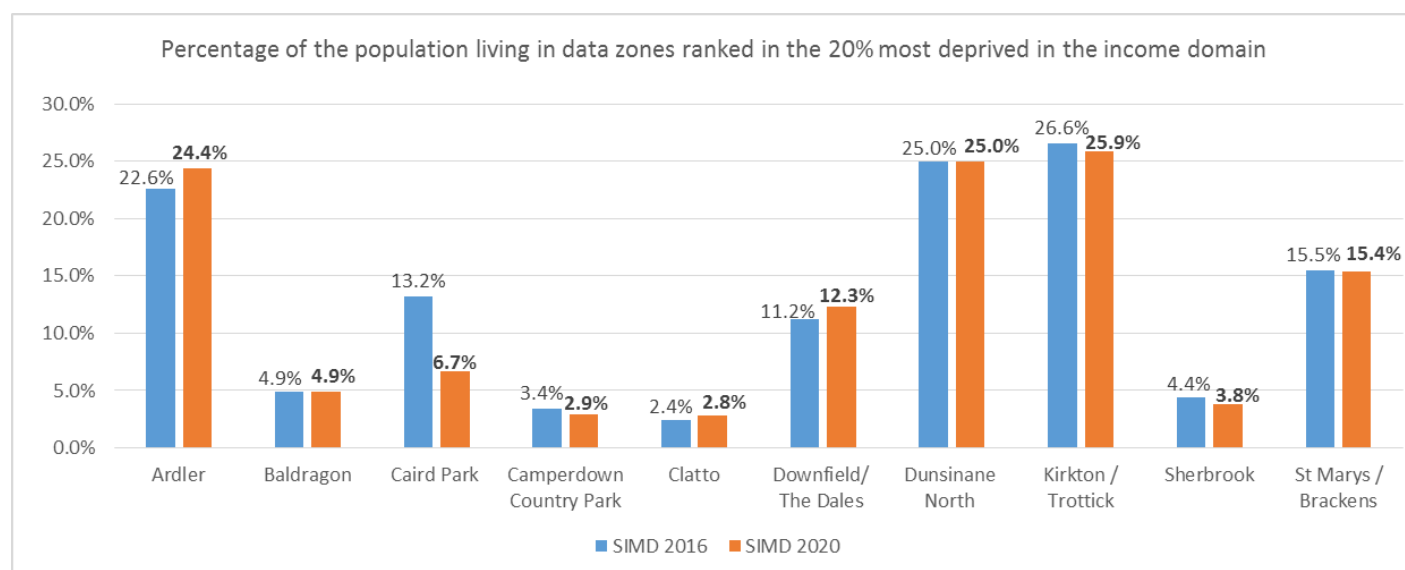

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When comparing the 2016 and 2020 SIMD, the level of change varied across the different community areas within Strathmartine LCPP/Ward. The percentage of the population who were classed as income deprived increased slightly in Ardler, Clatto and Downfield/The Dales. Ardler experienced the greatest increase from 22.6% in 2016 to 24.4% in 2020.

Decreases in the percentage of the population classed as income deprived occurred in Caird Park, Camperdown Country Park, Kirkton/Trottick, Sherbrook and St Marys/Brackens. Caird Park was the community area which experienced the greatest reduction. The percentage of the population who were classed as income deprived in Baldrigon (4.9%) and Dunsinane North (25.0%) remained at the same level as the 2016 SIMD.

Overall in Strathmartine LCPP/Ward level the percentage of the population classed as income deprived decreased slightly from 17.7% in 2016 to 17.2% in 2020. There was no change at Dundee City level with the percentage remaining at 16.4%.

## 9. Housing Domain

The housing domain in the Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation focusses on households that are over-crowded and persons in households without central heating.

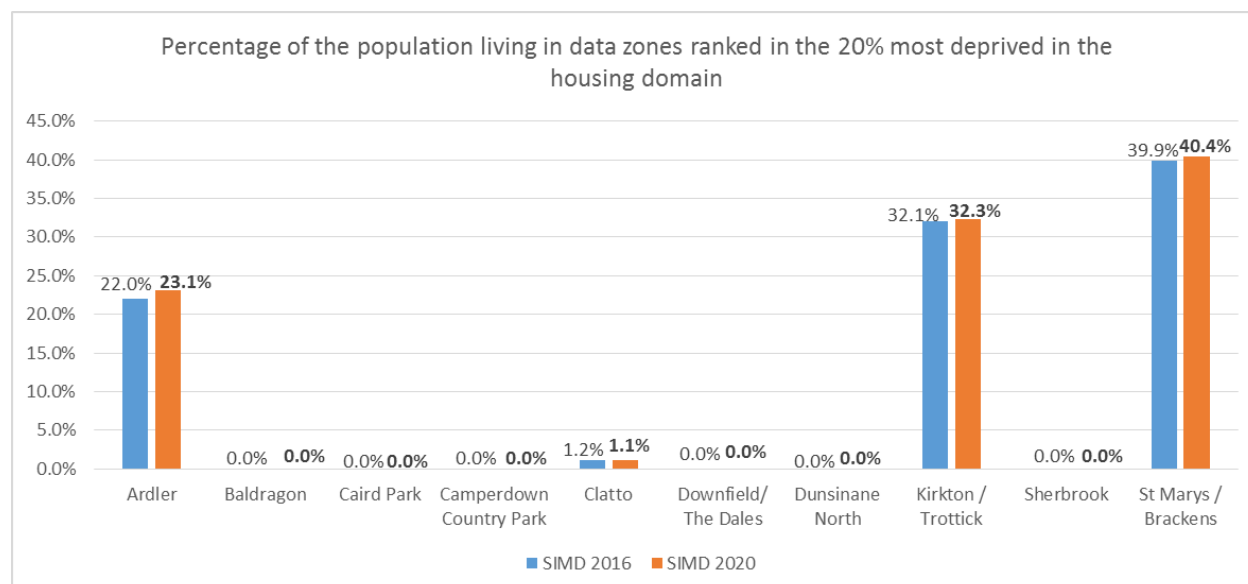
In the 2020 SIMD, St Mary's/Brackens (40.4%), Kirkton/Trottick (32.3%), Ardler (23.1%) and Clatto (1.1%) are the only community areas within Strathmartine LCPP/Ward where a proportion of the population live in a data zone that is ranked in the 20% most deprived in the housing domain. At an overall Strathmartine LCPP/Ward level, 24.4% live in a data zone ranked in the 20% most deprived in the housing domain, this is lower than the overall Dundee City level which stands at 45.5%.

In both the 2016 and 2020 SIMD publications, 0% of the population in Baldrigon, Caird Park, Camperdown Country Park, Downfield/The Dales, Dunsinane North and Sherbrook live in a data zone ranked in the 20% most deprived in the housing domain.

There were small increases equating to no more than 1% in the percentage of the population living in data zones ranked in the 20% most deprived in the housing domain in Ardler, Kirkton/Trottick and St Marys/Brackens. There was also a very small decrease in the percentage of the population living in data zones ranked in the 20% most deprived in the housing domain in Clatto from 1.2% in 2016 to 1.1% in 2020.

At an overall Strathmartine LCPP/Ward level the percentage of the population living in data zones ranked in the 20% most deprived in the housing domain increased slightly from 24.2% in 2016 to 24.4% in 2020. Similarly at a Dundee City level the percentage of the population living in data zones ranked in the 20% most deprived in the housing domain increased from 45.3% in 2016 to 45.5% in 2020.

## 10. Crime Domain

**Table 14** shows the percentage of the population who live in a data zone ranked in the 20% most deprived in the crime domain as reported in the 2016 and 2020 SIMD. The SIMD crime domain does not include all types of crime or offence recorded by the police. Certain crimes have been excluded because of data quality issues, or because they are less meaningful in terms of deprivation at a neighbourhood level.

The SIMD 2020 shows that the majority of the population who live in Camperdown Country Park (100%), Dunsinane North (100%), Kirkton/Trottick (65.9%) and Clatto (62.5%) live in a data zone that is ranked in the 20% most deprived in the crime domain. The percentage is lower in the other community areas ranging from 35.1% in Ardler to 0% in Baldrigon.

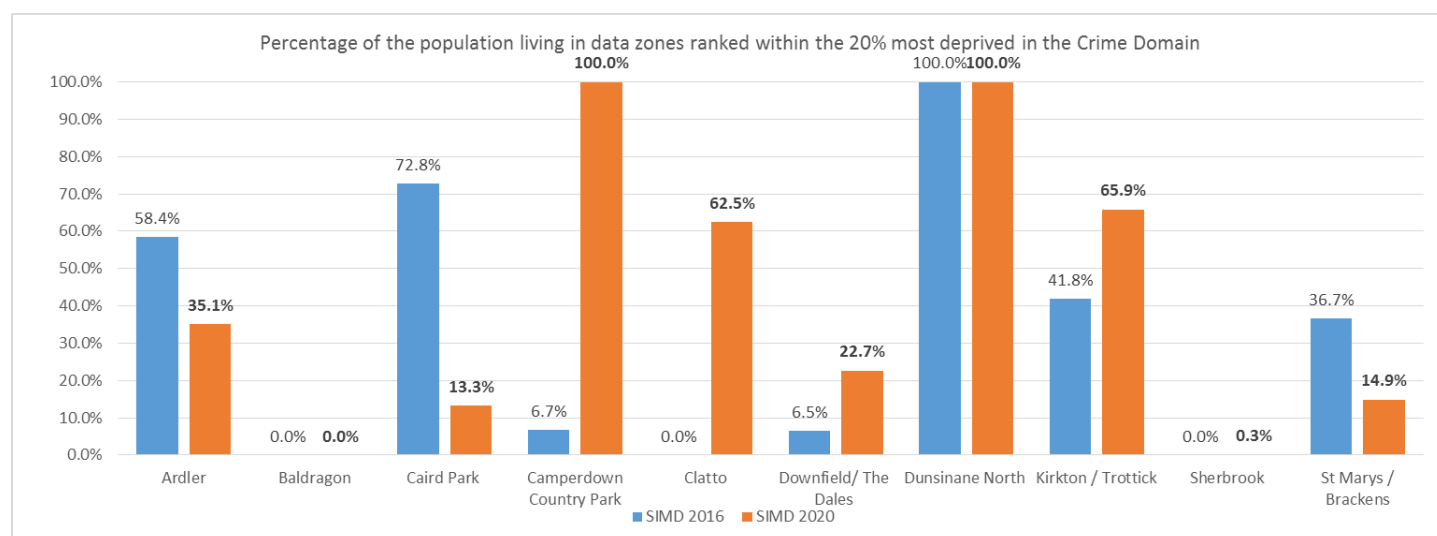
Overall in Strathmartine LCPP/Ward, 35.0% of the population live in a data zone ranked in the 20% most deprived in the crime domain this is slightly higher than the overall Dundee City level which stands at 33.1%.

When comparing the 2016 and 2020 SIMD, reductions in the percentage of the population living in data zones ranked in the 20% most deprived in the crime domain occurred in Ardler, Caird Park and St Marys/Brackens. The greatest decrease occurred in Caird Park from 72.8% in 2016 to 13.3% in 2020. Increases however occurred in Camperdown Country Park, Clatto, Downfield/The Dales, Kirkton/Trottick and Sherbrook. The levels of increase varied across the community areas with Camperdown Country Park experiencing the greatest increase from 6.7% in 2016 to 100% in 2020.

Overall in Strathmartine LCPP/Ward the percentage of the population living in data zones ranked in the 20% most deprived in the crime domain increased from 31.6% in 2016 to 35.0% in 2020. There was also an increase at a Dundee City level from 30.9% in 2016 to 33.1% in 2020.
