They have a wonderful display of spring daffodils, tulips and grape hyacinth just now to boost their spirits and lots of plans for more improvements to the site once they can get going again.

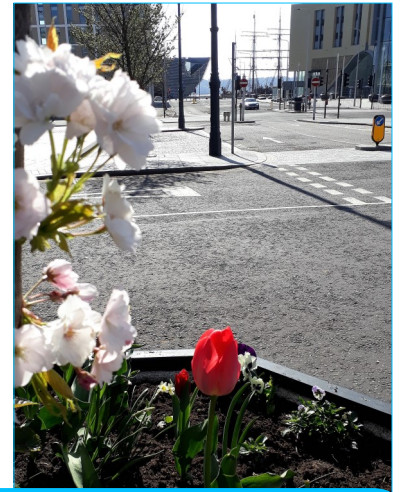
